Dear Professor Buckingham,

We are writing to you as representatives of students from across the UK to request that Universities UK takes a position of supporting a 'no detriment' policy for exams and assessments. Many of our universities have already announced this policy, but some of our institutions are yet to settle on a 'safety net' policy for our students, and we believe this shows the need for national leadership on the issue.

Since the COVID-19 crisis escalated, we have been working around the clock to support students. We have tried to work with our institutions at every stage to ensure that student and staff welfare is at the heart of every decision that is made.

Our students are now uncertain of their futures. They face precarious living and working situations, new and increased caring responsibilities and the loss of existing support structures. Many students lack the required technology, working space and time to succeed, and those with existing childcare responsibilities will find this compounded with the closure of schools. Disabled students are particularly impacted. Those who already find examinations inaccessible face significant disadvantage in online examinations, where some reasonable adjustments cannot be accommodated.

One of the most pertinent issues for current students, particularly disabled students, is the question of exams.

We believe that the best solution for both student and staff welfare is to cancel all non-essential exams, especially all those for students who would progress within the university for a further year of study. We know that this is already the policy in many universities and applaud the bold leadership of those who were first to initiate this.

Final year students, whether on a Masters course or finishing an undergraduate degree, should be given greater flexibility over their assessment process. It should not be compulsory for any student to have to sit an exam in the Summer to be able to graduate. We urge university leaders to give final year and taught postgraduate students choice over deferring their examination, taking an open book examination or submitting a dissertation, or using their accumulated credit to graduate with the classification they are currently working at. Where this is regulated by a professional body, we would like Universities UK to work with students and PSRBs to find compassionate solutions, including extensions and deferrals.

The students who are most disadvantaged by the impact of COVID-19 are also those who are already disadvantaged by attainment gaps in higher education. As a sector, we have

invested significant work in closing these gaps, spurred on by ambitious targets from the Office for Students in England. We are concerned that pushing ahead with summer examinations online will threaten this work. Advocating a 'no detriment' policy nationwide would offer these students reassurance and the confidence to work to improve their achievements, rather than the fear that the current unstable environment will leave them completing their degrees with unfairly low marks.

We believe that this approach will allow for student success and welfare through this difficult time, ensuring that no student whose circumstances have suddenly changed will be unduly disadvantaged in those institutions where examinations are proceeding. There is significant strength of feeling among the student body that this is the correct approach for the situation that we find ourselves in and thousands of students have signed petitions to their own Vice Chancellors and senior leaders to ask for a 'no detriment' policy to be implemented. We have included these below, where available, to illustrate this.

The academic community needs compassionate and ambitious leadership to navigate the impacts of the pandemic. We urge that you take this step for the reassurance and welfare of hundreds of thousands of students. We would be happy to meet virtually to discuss this further if required.
